# Master of Science in Nursing Adult-Gerontology Clinical Nurse Specialist (World Wide Web)

#### **Concentration Description**

The adult-gerontology clinical nurse specialist concentration prepares nurses for an advanced practice nursing role in various types of health care settings. Nationally approved clinical nurse specialist competencies in adult and gerontology are the basis of the curriculum. Emphasis is placed on providing students with advanced theoretical knowledge and practice skills needed to improve patient care, nursing and the organizational systems. This option provides preparation in the roles of clinician, educator, clinical consultant, researcher, program planner and leader. The 43-semester hour curriculum includes core courses, clinical core courses and concentration courses.

#### **Requirements for Admission**

Admission to the master of science in nursing program requires the student to meet the minimum admission requirements for graduate study of the university and the following requirements of the College of Nursing:

- A baccalaureate degree in nursing from an accredited program
- A minimum GPA of 2.7 in undergraduate studies and a minimum GPA of 3.0 in nursing major
- Acceptable score on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or the Miller Analogies Test (MAT) within the past five years
- Current non-restricted license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in North Carolina or an NCSBN-compact state (Individual advisement may be necessary for licensure regulations for online out-of-state students)
- Two years clinical experience prior to admission
- A statement of purpose essay describing the applicant's interest in graduate study as an adult-gerontology CNS, career goals and the MSN degree's relationship to those goals
- Three professional references
- A personal interview with a member of the graduate faculty
- A course in statistics with a grade of "C" or higher

#### **Requirements for Clinical Courses**

• All graduate students are required to maintain a grade average of "B."

- Graduation application must be submitted at least one semester prior to completing the degree requirements as stated in the graduate catalog.
- Students who do not register for courses for a semester must complete an electronic readmission form (available at <u>www.ecu.edu/gradschool/</u> and in the Graduate School Office).
- All graduate students complete a comprehensive assessment at the end of their program in NURS 6993.

• MSN students are required to keep graduate program/health requirements and liability insurance requirements up to date throughout program. Graduates are eligible to sit for national certification examinations as a clinical nurse specialist. This concentration was reviewed by the National Association of Clinical Nurse Specialists and meets the criteria for consistency with the standards set by that national organization.
