



Master of Science in Nursing Health Systems Leadership (Online)

Concentration Description

The nursing health systems leadership concentration is designed to facilitate the graduate nurse in the acquisition of knowledge and skills necessary for leadership positions within a variety of settings in the health-care delivery system. Students in the Health Systems Leadership concentration develop specialized knowledge in leadership including but not limited to theoretical and operational aspects of nursing leadership, human relations management, population health leadership, health policy, financial management or nursing informatics. Students take additional courses and participate in a 252-hour practicum experience in the focus area and role preference selected. Success in this 38-semester hour concentration requires computer proficiency since it is a 100% online offering.

Requirements for Admission

Admission to the master of science in nursing program requires the student to meet the minimum admission requirements for graduate study of the university and the following requirements of the College of Nursing:

- A baccalaureate degree in nursing from an accredited program
- A minimum GPA of 2.7 in undergraduate studies and a minimum GPA of 3.0 in nursing major
Note: Nursing Leadership may consider an applicant with a GPA less than 2.7 as an admit by exception candidate.
- No Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or the Miller Analogies Test (MAT) is required with an earned BSN
- One year experience as a registered nurse (RN)
- Current non-restricted license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in North Carolina or an NCSBN-compact state (Individual advisement may be necessary for licensure regulations for online out-of-state students)
- A statement of purpose essay describing the applicant's interest in graduate study, career goals and the MSN degree's relationship to those goals
- Three professional references
- A current resume
- A course in statistics with a grade of "C" or higher

Requirements for Clinical Courses
