Master of Science in Nursing Nursing Leadership – Post-Master's Certificate (World Wide Web)

Concentration Description

The nursing leadership concentration is designed to facilitate the graduate nurse in the acquisition of knowledge and skills necessary for leadership positions within the health-care delivery system. Students may choose from one of three foci: Leadership in Acute Care Health Systems, Leadership in Community-Based Health Systems or Leadership in Health Care Educational Systems. Students in all three of these concentration foci develop specialized knowledge and practice in leadership including but not limited to financial management, administrative and organizational theory and ethics, human resource management, health policy, law, and regulation. Students take additional courses and participate in practicum experience in the focus area and role preference selected. Success in this post-master's certificate requires computer proficiency since it is a 100% online offering.

Requirements for Admission

Admission requires the student to meet the minimum admission requirements for graduate study of the university and the following requirements of the College of Nursing:

- A master of science in nursing degree in nursing from an accredited program
- Current non-restricted license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in North Carolina or an NCSBN-compact state (Individual advisement may be necessary for licensure regulations for online out-of-state students)
- A statement of purpose essay describing the applicant's interest in graduate study, career goals and the certificate's relationship to those goals

• A current resume

- Three professional references
- A personal interview with a member of the graduate faculty
- · One year clinical experience as an RN

Requirements for Clinical Courses
