BSN ELIGIBILITY WORKSHEET FOR PROSPECTIVE TRANSFER STUDENTS

ABOUT THIS DOCUMENT

This worksheet was designed to help prospective transfer students interested in ECU's BSN program learn eligibility requirements and determine where they stand in completing the general education and prerequisite coursework required to apply to the program.

REQUIRED GENERAL EDUCATION AND PREREQUISITE COURSES

Required courses can be taken at ECU, a community college, or another regionally accredited college or university. For credits to officially transfer to ECU, a final grade of C or higher is required in the course. The following transfer resources can be used to look up established course equivalences at ECU:

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be an eligible BSN applicant, you must meet ALL the following criteria:

- Minimum cumulative GPA of a 2.75
 - The College of Nursing includes all college grades from all colleges attended when calculating GPA for admission; some exceptions may apply
- A final grade of C or higher in these specific prerequisite courses:
 - o MATH 1065, CHEM 1120, CHEM 1130, BIOL 2140 & 2141, BIOL 2150 & 2151, and BIOL 2110 & 2111
 - Pass/fail grades are not acceptable for these specific course requirements
 - ECU requires a grade of C or higher to transfer credit officially for all coursework completed at other institutions
- Completed all, or be enrolled in, final set of general education and prerequisite courses listed above at the time of application submission
 - If any courses are outstanding at the time of application submission, your application will not be considered, and you will receive an ineligible notification from the Office of Student Services; ineligible applications may count toward max attempts for admission
 - It is the applicant's responsibility to confirm they have completed, or are enrolled in, the correct equivalent courses to meet program requirements before submitting their application
- Completed at least one attempt on the <u>HESI A2 pre-nursing entrance exam</u>
- Submit a complete online application with all required documents by the application deadline noted below
 - o Incomplete applications will not be considered and may count against your max attempts for admission
 - Instructions for requesting access to the online BSN application are provided below

IMPORTANT NOTES

- Your application to the traditional BSN program at ECU will be considered a maximum of three times. Other BSN pathways at ECU may still be options.
- Students not currently enrolled at ECU must apply to East Carolina University by their BSN application deadline to be eligible to have their application reviewed for admission. Additionally, these students must be fully admitted to ECU by their notification date to remain eligible for program admission (see chart above). Information about applying to ECU can be found on the <u>Undergraduate Admission's website</u>. All university admission questions should be directed to their office by emailing <u>admission@ecu.edu</u> or calling 252-328-6640.
- Admitted students must successfully complete any required general education and prerequisite courses in progress at the time of application or their seat in the program will be rescinded.
- Admitted students must successfully pass a criminal background check and drug test or their seat in the program will be rescinded. Criminal convictions
 and pending criminal charges can impact a student's ability to begin nursing school. Questions regarding the BSN criminal background check and drug
 test requirements should be emailed to <u>CONAdvising@ecu.edu</u>.
- Applicants who have been previously admitted to but did not finish the clinical portion of an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program at a community college or Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program at another university must have left that program in good standing to be eligible to apply to the BSN program at ECU. These students are required to submit a letter from the Dean or Director of their former program with their application. (This does not include students who were pre-nursing or working on program prerequisites for nursing at another institution).
- Admission is competitive and based on the <u>College of Nursing Ranking Formula</u> and cumulative GPA which includes all college grades from all colleges attended. No additional criteria are reviewed or can influence admission to the BSN program. The admission process and criteria are subject to change at any time with faculty approval. Please monitor the <u>College of Nursing website</u> for current requirements and admission processes.

REQUESTING THE ONLINE BSN APPLICATION

Current students receive the application link from their advisor.
