Master of Science in Nursing Nurse-Midwifery (Hybrid Primarily Web)

Concentration Description

The nurse-midwifery concentration prepares professional nurses as practitioners of nurse-midwifery who are eligible for national certification. The 53 semester hour curriculum includes core courses, clinical core courses and concentration courses.

Requirements for Admission

Admission to the master of science in nursing program requires the student to meet the minimum admission requirements for graduate study of the university and the following requirements of the College of Nursing:

- A baccalaureate degree in nursing from an accredited program
- A minimum GPA of 2.7 in undergraduate studies and a minimum GPA of 3.0 in nursing major
 - Currently hold a non-restricted license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in North Carolina or a NCSBN compact state. Students must be residents of North Carolina to be accepted
 - A statement of purpose describing the applicant's interest in graduate study, career goals, and the MSN degree's relationship to those goals
- Three professional references
- Current resume
- A personal interview with a member of the midwifery faculty
- One year RN experience (Labor and Delivery preferred but not required)
- Demonstrate a commitment to practice with under-served populations

Though no applicant who falls below the ECU College of Nursing Graduate concentration minimum admission requirements (GPA of 3.0 and GRE at or above the 30th percentile) is guaranteed admission, ECU Graduate School policy allows requests for admission by exception. The ECU Graduate School makes final decisions on these requests. These criteria will be used to inform decisions at the concentration level regarding requests for admissions by exception.

- Above-minimum GPA (ie, 3.3+) although GRE is below the 30th percentile
- Above-minimum GRE although the GPA is below the admission minimum

Integration of Nurse-Midwifery Professional

- Mitigating circumstances to explain lower GPA with evidence that those circumstances have changed
- Completed graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution or completed at least 9 semester hours graduate work without a degree with a GPA at 3.2 or better
- Demonstrates success in current professional role as a nurse in clinical, research, policy, or healthcare improvement positions.
- Strong recommendations from experienced healthcare leader with first-hand knowledge of professional work
