Master of Science in Nursing Nurse-Midwifery – Post-Master's Certificate (Hybrid Primarily Web)

Concentration Description

Nurses with a master's degree in nursing complete the nurse-midwifery concentration courses and select core and/or clinical core courses based on their past course work and experience. Applicants for post-master's certificates complete a non-degree application for the Graduate School and are not required to provide GRE scores. This certificate requires 23 - 41 s.h. depending on the amount of experience.

Requirements for Admission

Admission requires the student to meet the minimum admission requirements for graduate study of the university and the following requirements of the College of Nursing:

- A master of science in nursing degree in nursing from an accredited program
- Current non-restricted license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in North Carolina or an NCSBN-compact state (Individual advisement may be necessary for licensure regulations for online out-of-state students) Students must be residents of North Carolina to be accepted.
- Must have a minimum of one year hospital-based RN experience (labor and delivery preferred, but not required)
- Demonstrate commitment to practice with underserved populations
- A statement of purpose essay describing the applicant's interest in graduate study, career goals and the certificate's relationship to those goals
- Three professional references, with one reference from an individual who is knowledgeable about the candidate's nursing practice
- A personal interview with a member of the graduate faculty
- A course in statistics with a grade of "C" or higher

Requirements for Clinical Courses

Information regarding clinical requirements can be found in the ECU College of Nursing Student Handbook at: https://nursing.ecu.edu/student-handbook/. Upon admission all graduate students are required to complete a criminal background check. Students will receive specific instructions from the Office of Student Services on how to complete this process. The concentration director will review the post-master's certificate student's transcripts to determine the appropriate plan of study for the individual student.

The concentration director will review the post-masters certificate student's transcripts and professional experiences in comparison to the program requirements to determine the appropriate plan of study for the individual student.

*Students who completed NURS 6993 to earn a previous Master of Science in Nursing degree from East Carolina University will satisfy this requirement by taking NURS 6500, Independent Study, to demonstrate professional competencies of the certificate program.

Requirements for Graduation

- All graduate students are required to maintain a minimum grade average of "B."
- Graduation application must be submitted at least one semester prior to completing the degree requirements as stated in the graduate catalog.
- Students who do not register for courses for a semester must complete an electronic readmission form (available at www.ecu.edu/gradschool/ and in the Graduate School Office).
- Students are required to keep graduate program/health requirements and liability insurance requirements up to date throughout their clinical courses.
- All post-master's certificate students will be required to complete a terminal program assessment as advised by the concentration director in the final semester.
