



## Doctor of Nursing Practice AGPCNP and FNP – Post-Doctoral Certificate (Hybrid Primarily Web)

### Concentration Description

Nurses with an earned DNP or PhD in Nursing may prepare for the nurse practitioner (NP) role by completion of the post-doctoral certificate. Applicants must complete an application with the Graduate School. This certificate requires 12-36 credit hours depending on the amount of clinical experience. A minimum of 500 clinical hours are required regardless of previous APRN experience.

### Requirements for Admission

Admission requires the student to meet the minimum admission requirements for graduate study of the university and the following requirements of the College of Nursing:

- A DNP or PhD in Nursing degree in nursing from an accredited program
- A minimum of one year of experience as a Registered Nurse (RN).
- Current non-restricted license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in North Carolina or an NCSBN-compact state.
- Basic computer competency with proficiency in development and use of databases, patient information systems, statistical sets, and use of various statistical packages for data analysis.
- Written statement of personal career, educational, and scholarship goals: identification of practice interests, leadership goals and match with program goals.
- Three written professional references from individuals with expertise to comment on the applicant's capability for doctoral scholarship. At least one reference must be from a doctoral prepared nurse.
- A current curriculum vita.
- A personal interview with a member of the graduate faculty

### Requirements for Clinical Courses

Information regarding clinical requirements can be found in the ECU College of Nursing Student Handbook at: <https://nursing.ecu.edu/student-handbook/>. Upon admission all graduate students are required to complete a criminal background check. Students will receive specific instructions from the Office of Student Services on how to complete this process. The concentration director will review the post-master's certificate student's transcripts to determine the appropriate plan of study for the individual student.
