Master of Science in Nursing Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner – (Online)

Concentration Description

The psychiatric-mental health nurse practitioner (PMHNP) concentration prepares professional nurses as safe and competent practitioners of psychiatric and mental health services who become eligible to sit for the certification exam given by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) upon graduation. The 47-semester hour concentration includes core courses, concentration courses, and clinical practicums (total of 550 hours). All content courses are offered online and the clinical experiences are arranged in a geographically convenient area for the student.

Requirements for Admission

Admission requires the student to meet the minimum admission requirements for graduate study of the university and the following requirements of the College of Nursing:

- A Bachelors of Science in nursing degree from an accredited program A current resume
- Current non-restricted license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in Three current professional references

• A personal interview with a member of the PMHNP faculty

- One year clinical experience as a RN
- Admission priority is given to applicants who have at least one year
 of psychiatric nursing experience and plan to provide direct care
 upon
- A statement of purpose essay describing the applicant's interest in program completion graduate study, career goals and the certificate's relationship to those goals

Upon admission all graduate students are required to complete a criminal background check. Students will receive specific instructions from the Office of Student Services on how to complete this process. - Graduation application must be submitted at least one semester prior to completing the degree requirements as stated in the graduate catalog.
- Students who do not register for courses for a semester must complete an electronic readmission form (available at https://gradschool.ecu.edu/ and in the Graduate School Office).
- Students are required to keep graduate program/health requirements and liability insurance requirements up to date throughout their clinical courses.
- All post-master's certificate students will be required to complete a terminal program assessment as advised by the concentration director in the final semester.
